Paragraph 1 - 4+ sentences introducing why you are writing this letter (based on the topic you chose).
Concluding sentence of this paragraph should transition into the next paragraph.
Paragraph 2 - 4+ sentences rationalizing or explaining why using examples, stories, other evidence to prove the point you are trying to prove or explain.
Chunk 3 - No sentence criteria but please include a conclusion that restates your point about why you have written this letter based upon the topic you chose.
Please end with a closing line (Sincerely, Musically, Best regards, Thanks for your time, etc.) and sign your name at the bottom.
